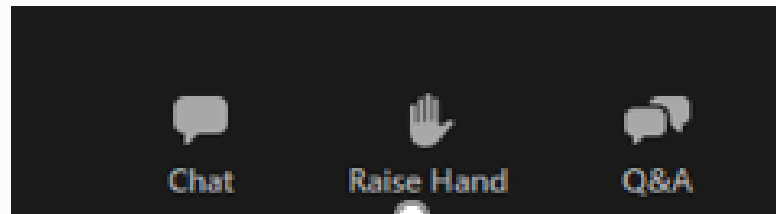

Khadija received the Scottish Trade Union Congress Equality Award in 2019 and is the first BAME Muslim educator to be elected as the Vice-Convenor of the General Teaching Council for Scotland (GTCS).

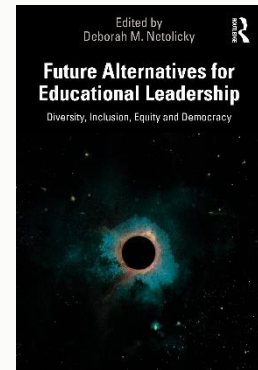

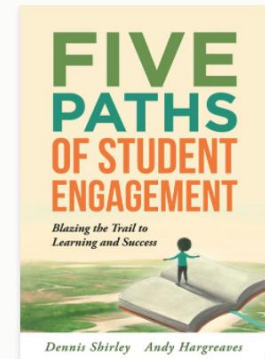


Andy Hargreaves
